Transfer Requirements

Students who plan to transfer to a four-year college or university can coordinate their transferable classes with an associate degree program so that they may receive an AA degree when they transfer.

Associate Degree Programs

Graduation Requirements

The following graduation requirements apply to first time and returning students enrolling Fall Semester 2009 and thereafter.

Students must complete 60 units of degree applicable work and fulfill the following specific requirements:

Scholarship Requirement

Students must have a cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 ("C") in all lower division coursework. Classes taken at any regionally accredited college, university or post-secondary school may be applied.

Only Citrus courses numbered 100 and above apply toward an Associate Degree.

A student must achieve a grade of "C" or better in each course taken to fulfill a requirement for a major.

Campus Residency Requirement

At least 12 units must be completed at Citrus College with the student attending Citrus during the last semester of his or her tenure. If the student cannot spend his or her last semester at Citrus College, 30 units must be taken at Citrus.

General Education Requirements

Citrus College offers three options of general education requirements tailored to a student's educational goals; for example, whether one plans to earn an AA degree only or transfer to a four-year college or university. All students must complete a Physical Education requirement: three units of Physical Education or Dance Activity or completion of PE 170, 171, or 173.

General Education Competency Requirements

Earning an associate degree from Citrus College represents more than an accumulation of units. The college is dedicated to leading students through learning experiences designed to develop certain capabilities and insights. Therefore, classes in language arts, writing, mathematics, natural science, arts and humanities, and social sciences are required so that students have the knowledge needed to compete globally, contribute to the economic growth of society and achieve their personal goals.

Multiple Majors

It is possible for a Citrus College student to complete the requirements for more than one major if he/she meets the minimum requirements for each major and completes a minimum of 18 units exclusively to each major.
