### Honors Courses

The Honors Program is designed for highly motivated students who are planning to transfer and want an enriched academic experience. Honors courses are designed to meet transfer requirements for University of California (UC) or California State University (CSU) campuses, as well as many private institutions. A variety of Honors courses are offered each semester.

### Honors Program Benefits

- Small class sizes offering individualized interaction between faculty and students
- Academic and social interaction with other highly motivated and successful students
- Citrus College Honors Transfer Alliance Program that increases the likelihood of a successful transfer application to UCLA
- Citrus College honors agreements with local colleges and universities that provide priority processing to transfer applications

### Transfer Benefits

Students completing the Honors Program requirements will be eligible for transfer benefits from several leading colleges and universities including: UCLA, UC Irvine, Cal Poly Pomona,



Pitzer, Occidental and CSU Fullerton's business program.

### Honors Program Eligibility and Completion

To successfully complete the Honors Program you will need to:

- Complete 15 units of Honors courses with a "C" or better in each course and at least 6 units per year
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or higher
- Complete 30 hours of community service or campus extracurricular activities after joining the Honors Program
- Complete MATH 150 and ENG 101 with a "C" or better
- Meet with an Honors Program counselor at least once a semester

### Honors Application Deadlines

**Priority Filing Period for Fall:** February 1-July 1

**Fall:** August 15

**Priority Filing Period for Spring:** August 1-November 1

**Spring:** November 30

Applications received after these deadlines will be reviewed on a rolling basis as time and class space permits.

### Honors Program Entrance Requirements

#### *New Student*

- 3.25 high school GPA (non-weighted) or 3.5 GPA (weighted)
- Eligible for English 101\*
- Submit a 300-350 word essay that tells us who you are, and who you would like to be.
- Completed Honors Program application
- Completed Citrus College application
- One letter of recommendation from an instructor, counselor or high school contact
- Submit high school transcripts
- Meet with Honors Program counselor or coordinator

#### *Transfer Student*

- Nine units of completed college-level course work (level 100 and up)
- 3.25 cumulative GPA
- Eligible for English 101 or completion of equivalent\*
- Submit a 300-350 word essay that tells us who you are, and who you would like to be.
- Completed Honors Program application
- Completed Citrus College application
- One letter of recommendation from an instructor, counselor or high school contact
- Submit all college or university transcripts
- Meet with Honors Program counselor or coordinator

#### *Current Citrus College Student*

- Six units of completed college-level course work (level 100 and up)
- 3.25 cumulative GPA
- Eligible for English 101\*
- Submit a 300-350 word essay that tells us who you are, and who you would like to be.
- Completed Honors Program application
- Completed Citrus College application
- One letter of recommendation from an instructor, counselor or high school contact
- Meet with Honors Program counselor or coordinator

\* Based on assessment test or equivalent.
